for detailed checks and follow-up work The time needed for repairs depends on the complexity of the work and whether the materials are easily available If any potential dangers are identified the HD takes immediate action to stop the public using the facilities This is to ensure safety Children should also use playgrounds properly to keep themselves safe for example, by reading playground notice boards and using equipment suited to their age and ability Parents should be present to help their toddlers and look after them Playgrounds are public property We must all look after our playgrounds so our children can play safely there
