- whereby offenders may be prosecuted
- CCTVs are installed in estates to monitor and
- deter the throwing of objects from a height
- They also help HD staff locate the offenders

To collect evidence for prosecuting offenders

the HD has acquired an advanced digital system

which can target at a specific area

for continuous monitoring

When the computerised equipment detects

something falling from a height

it will record the entire process on camera

thus providing law enforcers with evidence

It also sends an SMS to the estate staff

for them to take immediate action

Apart from using advanced equipment, the HD

also hires a special squad of retired policemen

to probe into cases in estate as scheduled

and to assist in prosecuting offenders

The special squad is sophisticatedly equipped

Concealing strategically, it stakes out

day and night to monitor the suspects

When enough evidence is in hand

actions will be taken against the offenders

No matter how hard HD staff works

to stamp out throwing objects from a height

it can't outplay the importance of self-discipline
