Presenter	Knowing the fire escape routes is crucial
	Everyone must be clear about
	where all the fire escapes routes are in your building
	In this episode, I'll continue to talk about
	situations that may arise during a fire
	and the way to react to them
	So stay tuned
Super	If there's smoke outside the fire door
VO	When leaving your flat, try to crouch down
	Open the fire door a crack
	to see if there's smoke outside the door
	If there is, go along the corridor at once
	to find another staircase for escaping
	If there's no obstruction and things are fine
	call 999 at once when you reach a safe spot
	Inform the Fire Services Department
	wait for the firemen to come and
	tell them about the situation at the scene
Super	If all staircases are covered in heavy smoke
VO	If all nearby staircases are filled with smoke
	go back to the flat if possible
	Crawl along the ground when there's smoke
	because hot air rises
	and the air near the ground is cooler

	and less smoky
	After returning to the flat
	seal the door gaps with duct tape or wet clothing
	to prevent smoke from permeating
	Then call 999 immediately
	Tell the Fire Services Department
	where exactly you are trapped in
	Wave colourful clothing from your window
	to alert firefighters to your location
Super	If there's smoke along the way
VO	If you encounter smoke in the staircase
	and can't go back home
	go to a flat nearby to seek shelter
Super	If you can't leave the building and can't go back to your flat
VO	If all escape routes are impassable
	and you can't leave the building
	or go back to your flat
	go up to the roof as a last resort
	But the roof is just a temporary respite
	It's not the safest place
	because the smoke and flames will continue to rise
Presenter	Remember the precautionary measures
	We must not only do our best to prevent fire
	but also know the escape routes
	and take part in fire drills
	so as to keep ourselves safe
