## Environmental Collection and Recycling Campaign

To boost staff's environmental awareness, the Hong Kong Housing Authority (HA) has recently joined hands with The Salvation Army Hong Kong, a non-profit organisation, to organise Environmental Collection and Recycling Campaign. Staff were encouraged to reduce and recycle surplus household items by donating them to the needy for further use.

The campaign was held from 15 to 28 January at the HA Headquarters, Lung Cheung Office Building, and HA Customer Service Centre. With keen support of staff, over two tonnes of reusable items were collected, including clothing, handbags, household goods, bedding, books, and toys. All collected items will be sold at affordable prices to low-income families at The Salvation Army Family Store.
