### HOUSING · I&T Summit

Jointly organised by the Housing Bureau and the Hong Kong Housing Authority (HA), the HOUSING · I&T Summit was held between 4 and 7 November 2025, with its aims to incorporate innovations into the future development of housing in Hong Kong and accelerate the pace of building better homes for the public. The four-day event, themed “Pioneering Innovative Housing for a Sustainable Future”, gathered over 400 experts, scholars, industry leaders, professionals and government officials from more than 15 countries and cities. The Summit offers a valuable platform for cross-regional technical exchanges and identifying solutions to housing challenges together.

At the Opening Ceremony, the Secretary for Housing, Ms Winnie Ho, highlighted Hong Kong’s role as a “super connector” and “super value adder”, fostering cross-regional collaboration to drive technological innovation of public housing construction and sustainable development of the city.



The first two days featured a symposium focusing on four themes – “Smart · Housing”, “Smart · Innovation”, “Smart · Community” and “Smart · Living”, with in-depth discussions on innovative development in housing construction technology. An on-site exhibition area was set up to showcase innovative technology applications aligned with these themes.

The Secretary for Housing and guests visited the Better Housing Exhibition, organised by the Centre of Science and Technology Industrial Development of the Ministry of Housing and Urban-Rural Development from the People’s Republic of China. The exhibition aims to inspire public and private housing sectors worldwide to explore new possibilities for future homes.

A visit to a smart Modular Integrated Construction (MiC) factory in Zhuhai was arranged on the third day. Equipped with a robotics-powered production line, the factory enabled participants to experience the latest construction technology for the future housing development.

The Summit culminated with site visits to Light Public Housing (LPH) at Olympic Avenue, Kai Tak and Choi Hing Road, Ngau Tau Kok. Attendees were impressed by the simple and comfortable design of LPH, facilitating our in-depth discussions on future development of construction technology with academics from Australia and Japan.
