Announcement from Labour Department – Flexible arrangement for Employees who are unable to complete Mandatory Safety Training Revalidation Courses in time

This serves to draw your attention to the captioned announcement published by Labour Department (LD).

The COVID-19 pandemic in Hong Kong has stabilised in the past few weeks. LD notices that training course providers (“TCPs”) have gradually resumed normal operation. Owing to the lead time for TCPs to provide Mandatory Safety Training (“MST”) revalidation courses to the employees affected (i.e. employees holding an MST certificate that expires from December 30, 2019 to June 15, 2020), and that such employees may not be able to enrol on MST revalidation courses (“revalidation courses”) before the expiry of admission period¹, LD introduces the following special arrangements for the afore-mentioned affected employees:-

- i) allowing those who are not able to enrol on revalidation courses to continue to be engaged in the specified work (details at column C of the table below); and
- ii) extending the admission deadlines for various revalidation courses for these employees (details at column D of the table below).

[¹According to the prevailing mechanism, employees are allowed to enrol on the relevant revalidation courses within 3 to 6 months (depending on the types of MST courses) after the expiry of their MST certificates.]

- Employees holding an MST certificate with an expiry date falling within the period specified in column B should enrol on the relevant revalidation course as soon as possible.
- LD would like to emphasise that the above arrangements are an exceptional one in light of the pandemic, and should not be seen as a precedent.

- If employers through the above special arrangements employ the employees who are not able to enrol on the relevant revalidation courses, they shall continue to comply with other provisions made under the occupational safety and health law, so as to ensure these employees working in safe and healthy working environments and to prevent the occurrence of accidents. Such employees should also be arranged to peruse the “Work Safety Alerts” animation videos and related information relevant to employees’ work:

- Employees are also reminded to strictly follow the method statements of employers and implement the relevant working procedures while at work to safeguard the occupational safety and health of themselves as well as other employees.
- The above arrangements are not applicable to the employees holding a certificate that expires on or after June 16, this year. Pursuant to the current requirement, they shall hold a valid certificate when engaged in the specified work.
