Hong Kong's summer days are hot and humid and workers undertaking manual work and working in hot environments are at risk of heat stroke if appropriate preventive measures are not taken.

The adoption of effective measures to control occupational hazards caused by hot working environments not only helps ensure the safety and health of workers, but also benefits organisations by increasing work efficiency and productivity due to decreased absenteeism.
