For example, risk assessment

or safety management plan can be further improved

It is hoped that we can build a relationship with them beforehand

and try to reduce risks

Another one is about education

We all know that a lot of infrastructure works have been started

Many stakeholders have considerable experience

The Labour Department will organise some sharing sessions

Could construction companies and stakeholders share your experience with us?

To let us understand more

Just like what's been done today

The third one is publicity

We all know that we often hold a safety competition

especially on site safety

What is the aim?

It is to develop a safety culture

This is what we aim to

When we have a better safety culture

The number of accidents will be reduced

to help the industry upgrade the level of occupational safety and health?

In fact, last year, the Labour Department and OSHC found that

"Three Safety Buddies to Safeguard Your Work at Height" is very useful and it gains support and recognition from the industry

It is very successful

In order to further understand the features and restrictions of equipment

A guide has recently been published

Safety Guide on Use of Light-duty Working Platform and Mobile Working Platform

I hope the industry will know more about the relevant information

OSHC has cooperated with the Labour Department

and launched a Light-duty Working Platform Sponsorship Scheme for SMEs

We welcome the industry to continue to support and apply for the scheme and to use appropriate working platforms

Apart from that

OSH Star Enterprise – RMAA Safety Accreditation Scheme

is our focus of promotion

Since the scheme has been implemented for four years

and the time is right

Scheme

We will also invite enterprises with 50 people or more to participate

Everyone joins together to do a good job in occupational safety and health

At the beginning of the Forum, the Chairman has also mentioned that on August 11 there will be a launching ceremony to support the OSH Star Enterprise Accreditation

It is hoped that through the activities in the market

more organisations will support the scheme

and select star enterprises as their first choice

more organisations will participate in the scheme

In addition, we will continue to keep in close contact with the industry
