including Contract managers, Site Staff and Contractors.
We are sending them emails.

The process should be done by today or tomorrow.

So you should all have your login names and passwords.

After 1 May, you can fill out the F787 through the system for accidents, incidents in which no one is injured, near-miss incidents and occupational diseases.

You can input information through the system.

If you still cannot receive your login name and password tomorrow,

remember to call Mr Cheung's helpline.
