I would like to ask if there is any idea that for a medium-sized management company now using 18001 how much time and money does it require to switch to ISO45001 successfully?
Is the three-year grace period sufficient?
What does the property management company need to prepare now?

Firstly, thank you for your question I believe that you come from a company with OHSAS 18001 ISO 45001 has never been executed before The first thing to do is to let your staff learn this standard Any certification requires a clear record 45001 requires at least three-month records so as to prove you are using this system As for OHSAS 18001, although there are many areas different from that of 45001 the change in the operation is not too much do not need to worry too much Three-year grace period is considered enough As for the budget, we can't answer Because we don't interfere with the investment amount of company

insufficient retroreflective performance
But that uniform is the one designed
by the Construction Industry Council (CIC)

the light blue one
If it is not enough
how can we improve and supplement it?

We can't wear that one?

The CIC's uniform is designed mainly to resist heat stress that belt may probably be a 3M belt That is used for the headlights It means when the vehicle's headlight shines on it it will become reflective What we are talking about now is a high risk activity - lifting operation Whether the crane operator or the gang of lifting personnel can see and probably know where they are So its function is not like this In fact, it is very simple The Housing Department has requirements for reflective clothing Reflective clothing that meets the requirements of the Housing Department is already acceptable Everyone can refer to it the Housing Department has specified the requirement of the Housing Department is very close to the Highways Department but the colour is different

Because the one in the Construction Industry Council

is not a reflective vest
That is a work uniform recommended by CIC
However, it is not a reflective vest
